Traffic violations such as speeding, running red lights, and illegal parking are among the most common offenses in urban areas. These actions not only endanger the offenders themselves but also pose serious risks to pedestrians and other drivers. To address this problem, law enforcement agencies have implemented a range of strategies, including increased patrols, automated traffic cameras, and stricter penalties. While some drivers argue that traffic fines are merely a way for governments to generate revenue, studies have shown that visible police presence and consistent enforcement significantly reduce the number of accidents. In many cities, officers focus their efforts during rush hours, when the likelihood of reckless driving is highest. Moreover, traffic enforcement plays a key role in promoting public safety and reducing emergency medical room visits caused by road accidents.
